Additional potential hazards associated with a person's disability	<ul> <li>Additional measures may need to be taken to enable visitors with a disability to engage with the activity.</li> <li>If using the tabletop bow set-up then the bow should be appropriately clamped to the table.</li> </ul>		Additional staff may be required.  Additional time may need to be factored into the session.  For visitors with disabilities a discussion with the participant along with visiting staff/carer should be had to ensure the most appropriate equipment is used.
