Infections and poisoning.	<ul> <li>No plants, Berries or fungi to be eaten.</li> </ul>	Water to be an hand when fire are lit	
Burn injuries from fires	<ul> <li>Group to be briefed on safe lighting and management of fires.</li> <li>A limit on the number of fires, ideally one main fire managed by the instructor and then small fire lighting sessions involving students.</li> <li>No running near fires and no pushing rules enforced.</li> <li>Long hair and loose clothing to be</li> </ul>	Water to be on-hand when fires are lit	

Burn injuries from friction fire lighting	<ul> <li>Fires to be extinguished by staff only and sites to be doused with water.</li> <li>If cooking food, clear instructions to be given on safe distance to be kept from fire, sitting / kneeling near fires (ie; not standing) and safe use of skewers for toasting marshmallows, allow cooked food to cool before eating and do not wave lit marshmallows around but instead blow them out.</li> <li>Any stick which is poked in the fire then stays in the fire.</li> <li>For Handwashing, any alcohol spray that is used should be away from the fire and hands should be dry before returning near the fire.</li> <li>Group to be briefed about hot</li> </ul>

Illness/Allergies	<ul> <li>Information about existing medical conditions known by staff.</li> </ul>	Adrenalin auto injector etc.	
Additional potential hazards associated with a person's disability	<ul> <li>Additional measures may need to be taken to enable visitors with a disability to access the area on site and engage with the activity.</li> </ul>	A discussion with the participant along with visiting staff/carers should be had to decide on the most appropriate way to access the site. Or whether a more accessible location is used.  Additional staff and time may be factored into the session.  Handling belts may be used to assist less ambulant users  Less mobile visitors may be more sensitive to environmental
